

Your Research

Does not meet expectations:

Your research is incomplete. You use phrases like "I don't know" or "I couldn't find this." There are pieces of your research

missing.

Approaching expectations:

You did your research pretty well but some areas are missing. The sentences did not have lots of details or were simple sentences.

Meets expectations:

All areas are filled

in completely with

robust sentences

that explain the

information.

Research is correct

and on time.

Complex/Compound Sentences

Does not meet expectations:

You forgot to do a complex/compound sentence. You one but you forgot to add punctuation and the spelling is incorrect.

Approaching expectations:

You did a compound and complex sentence but it wasn't quite correct. The sentence Was correct but the spelling was wrong.

Meets **expectations:**

You have used one or more compound and complex sentences in your research project. The sentence is used correctly and the punctuation and spelling are correct.

Subjects and Predicates

Does not meet expectations:

None or few of your sentences are full and complete and use subjects and predicates.

Approaching expectations:

Many or most of your sentences are full and complete and use subjects and predicates.



Meets expectations:

All of your sentences are full and complete and use subjects and predicates.

Does not meet expectations:

You did not correctly use any vocabulary words from Unit 1 or the ones you did use were not used correctly.

Grammar

Does not meet expectations:

Few or none of your sentences use correct spelling and punctuation throughout your project. If there were words you did not know how to spell you guessed how to spell them and may have spelled them incorrectly.

Approaching expectations:

Some or many of your sentences use correct spelling and punctuation throughout your project. If there were words you did not know how to spell, you guessed how to spell them and may have spelled them incorrectly.



Meets expectations:

You have used correct spelling and punctuation throughout your project. If there were words you did not know how to spell, you used a dictionary to find them.

PenmanShip

Does not meet expectations:

Your paper is not written in cursive and there are lots of marks on your paper and words are pushed together. Instead of erasing completely, you wrote over your mistakes and words are hard to read.

Approaching **expectations:**

Your paper is written in cursive but there are lots of marks on your paper and words are pushed together. Instead of erasing completely you wrote over your mistakes.

Meets **expectations:**

Your paper is Written in cursive and is easy to read. There are no eraser marks and words are correctly spaced.

Presentation

Does not meet expectations:

You mumbled or chose not to present. You did not make eye contact with your audience. You did a silly voice.

Approaching expectations:

You spoke with a small but clear voice. You made eye contact sometimes with your audience. You giggled alot.





Meets expectations:

You spoke with a strong and clear

voice. You made

eye contact

with your

audience. You

took it seriously.

Time Management

Does not meet expectations:

You did not use class time wisely and had to be asked several times to refocus on your work. You did not finish the project.

Approaching expectations:

You sometimes use class time wisely but had to be asked a few times to refocus on your work. Your project was rushed at the end.

You used your

class time

wisely and

worked

appropriately

and efficiently.
